Covid-19 Catch Up Funding

Following the 2020 lockdown due to the Covid-19 pandemic, schools have received an additional amount of money to provide 'catch-up' support for those who require it.

The catch-up premium is funded on a per pupil basis at £80 per pupil based on the previous year's census.

Morecambe Bay Community Primary School will be in receipt of £21,680 paid in two instalments across the school year.

Further money will be coming into the budget after the 2021 Lockdown known as Recovery Premium. Once we know how much it will be added into these amounts. For this school, allocated money received so far will be: Autumn 2020 - £12,646, Spring 2021 - £0, Summer 2021 - £9,034.

Schools have the flexibility to spend their allocation in the best way for their children and circumstances.
